



# A MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR



Dear Friends of Champlain Area Trails,

"Connectivity." That's what I emphasized during a presentation at Clinton Community College when I explained how conserving habitat connections allow wildlife to move through the landscape. Next, I described CATS' goal of town-to-town trails and that our Grand Hikes connect people with nature and promote economic vitality.

During the question-answer period, one student asked, "Could you say that **connectivity defines all of your work** because you provide passageways for animals and for people?" My answer was, "**That's exactly true!**"

CATS trails connect people to the land and bring communities together. Last year, we held a record number of outdoor education hikes and three town-to-town hikes. And, we built seven miles of new trails while conserving 245 more acres of land.

As a CATS Donor, you make all this happen! In fact, your support does so much more. Last year's Adirondack Harvest Festival is a prime example. Champlain Area Trails came together with the Regional Office of Sustainable Tourism, Westport representatives, Hub-on-the-Hill, and local farms to host two big hikes and a farmers' market highlighting local farms, food, breweries, and music.

Success builds on success and creates new opportunities and challenges. Big ones! Like these:

- Governor Cuomo just announced his goal of completing the Empire State Trail by 2020 which features a bike route through the Champlain Valley to the Canadian Border.
- The proposed **Adirondack Cuisine Trail** from Ticonderoga to Keeseville is a driving route for people to visit local farms, markets, and restaurants.
- National Geographic designated the Champlain Valley's "Lakes to Locks Passage" as a "geotourism" site to
  promote tourism and the economic health of communities.
- The North Country Scenic Trail is locating a trail route connecting state land to the Champlain Bridge.
- The **Adirondack Community-based Trails and Lodging System** is developing a system of hut-to-hut trails to link towns throughout the Adirondack Park.

What does this mean for CATS? We advise these initiatives to connect them to our trails, advance shared goals, and boost the local economy.

# **AWARDS AND GRANTS**





CATS is fortunate to have been awarded many generous grants in 2016 that support the broad range of our programs and initiatives including land conservation, outdoor education, trail improvements, office supplies, and staffing. Thank you to the following grantors for investing in the Champlain Valley.

**Adirondack Foundation Generous Act** – \$1,750 to cover costs related to sending CATS Stewardship Coordinator to Land Trust Alliance training workshops.

Adirondack Garden Club's Ellen Lea Paine Memorial Nature Fund – \$1,000 for outdoor education.

**American Hiking Society –** \$1,000 to support the Volunteer Vacation program.

**Clinton County Complete Streets Program –** \$900 for signs at the Thrall Dam Park Trail.

**Cloudsplitter Foundation –** \$20,000 for purchasing the Wildway Passage property, outdoor education and CATS Long Pond Conservancy's West Shore Conservation Project.

Essex Community Fund (administered by the Adirondack Foundation) – \$1,500 in memory of Bruce Klink, a CATS founder, for signs at the new Essex Gateway Trail.

International Paper Foundation - \$2,000 to help print and distribute the 2016/2017 CATS Trail Map. (Note: IP's Ticonderoga Mill also donated the paper for the map produced from trees harvested in Adirondack working forests.)

Kelsey Foundation - \$10,000 for the Long Pond West Shore Conservation Project.

Klipper Family Fund and the Open Space Institute – \$70,000 for the Duca Conservation Easement in Westport.

New York State Conservation Partnership Program (NYSCPP) Professional Development Grant (administered by the Land Trust Alliance, in coordination with the State Department of Environmental Conservation) – CATS received the second half of the \$70,000 grant awarded in 2015 to support the Stewardship Coordinator position.

**NYSCPP Transaction Grant –** \$30,000 to support the transaction and trail-building costs for the Duca Conservation Easement.

**Norcross Wildlife Foundation –** \$1,500 to purchase a sign for the CATS office, tools for trail work, and a screen for PowerPoint presentations.

# MAKING NEW TRAILS

As the last part added to the Adirondack Park, the Champlain Valley has little public land and until CATS began, few hiking trails. Every year CATS works with private landowners to allow for trails on their properties. After finding the best route, CATS staff and volunteers make the trails. Some are completed in days; others, like the Sophie's Lair Trail in Willsboro, can take several years because of difficult or wet terrain and the need for bridges and boardwalks. The result is you have wonderful places to enjoy throughout the year.

### Grand Hike to the Essex Inn

The 2016 Grand Hike began in Wadhams where over 250 people set out on the Wadhams Overlook Trail, made their first hikes on the new Long Valley Trail, enjoyed Oasis 1 at Ted Cornell's Art Farm and followed its trail to the Field and Forest Trail. They continued hiking on several more trails and passed three more oases before arriving for the Block Party at the Essex Inn.

### Adirondack Harvest Festival Featured Two CATS Hikes

Synergy is the word that describes trails and the resurgence of "local food" farms. With innovative, young farmers setting the trend for locally grown, healthy food and Champlain Area Trails promoting town-to-town hiking, the Regional Office of Sustainable Tourism took notice and organized community members, CATS, and the farming community to present the first Adirondack Harvest Festival in September at the Essex County Fairgrounds in Westport. # **ACHIEVEMENTS - SAVING LAND**

**CATS Saves 120 Acres in Split Rock Wildway** – As Tom Duca, of Essex, considered buying 120 acres in Westport, he asked if the property was of conservation interest to CATS. Yes! It was a key parcel in the Split Rock Wildway wildlife corridor linking Split Rock Wild Forest on Lake Champlain to the Adirondack Mountains. Plus, it's part of the view from Coon Mountain and has a portion of the trail we want between Westport and Essex. Thanks to grants from the Klipper Family Fund, Open Space Institute and New York State Conservation Partnership Program along with private contributions, CATS purchased a conservation easement protecting the ecological features and providing for the new Hemlock Hill Trail.





The Duca Property features farmland, forest and views toward the Adirondack High Peaks. Tom Duca did a "bargain sale" of the conservation easement by selling below its appraised market value.

**Clinton County Conservation Success** – In 1990, Dick and Leanna DeNeale purchased 128 acres of forest in Beekmantown almost sight unseen. If the woods were cleared, there would be spectacular views but the DeNeales wanted to allow the forest become "old growth." So they donated a conservation easement to CATS that preserves the woods and allows for a hiking trail.





Dick and Leanna DeNeale worked with CATS to preserve part of the large intact forest on Murtaugh Hill that serves as research site for SUNY Plattsburgh and where CATS can create a new hiking trail.

# ACHIEVEMENTS - SAVING LAND




**CATS Long Pond Conservancy Program Preserves Southwest View –** The view toward Long Pond's southwest corner is a pristine vision of lakefront forest, a small ridge, and the distant High Peaks. Frank White and Christine Babson saved that vista forever when they donated their 25 acres to CATS. A house on the ridge would have marred the view so they worked with CATS' Long Pond Conservancy Program to arrange for the gift. CATS will make a trail that hikers can access from the Carver Road Trail in Willsboro.

**Progress and a Unique Opportunity at Long Pond –** The CATS Long Pond Conservancy Program is half way toward raising the \$300,000 to purchase 48 acres and preserve the view of the pristine western shoreline. The land is being sold by the 1812 Homestead Living History Museum to help support rebuilding the three buildings recently destroyed by a fire. Therefore, donations to save the land will help the museum and its mission of showing how people lived in the early 1800's.





The funds donated to purchase and save 48 acres at Long Pond will preserve views of the western shoreline and support rebuilding the recently burned buildings at the 1812 Homestead Living History Museum – a "most wonderful place for educating people of a time gone by!"

Everyone enjoyed the winter tree identification hike at the Beaver Flow Trail led by renowned naturalist and illustrator Sheri Amsel.




The spring Hawk Watch at Coot Hill led by teacher and naturalist Gregg Van Deusen, is one of CATS most popular outdoor education hikes.


