

**Summer Land Stewardship Intern
Champlain Area Trails
Westport, New York**



**Opportunity to join a trails and land conservation organization
in the beautiful Lake Champlain Region of New York's Adirondack Park**

Organizational Information: Champlain Area Trails (CATS), a 501(c)3 nonprofit corporation, began in 2009 when its founders acted on a long-held dream of establishing a network of trails in the Champlain Valley with the mission of *making trails, saving land, connecting people with nature, and promoting economic vitality*. Since its founding, CATS has developed 42 trails totaling more than 80 miles and promotes 88 additional hiking trails in New York's Champlain Valley through its many partnerships. CATS has protected 983 acres for natural habitat, wildlife migration, and sustainable farming. Every year area residents and regional, national, and international visitors enjoy thousands of experiences in this outdoor wonderland. CATS is an accredited land trust through the Land Trust Accreditation Commission which affirmed it has sound finances, practices ethical conduct and responsible governance, and can ensure lasting stewardship.

Summary of Responsibilities: Champlain Area Trails (CATS) seeks two Summer Land Steward Interns. The position will average 40 hours per week. The Summer Stewardship Interns will work from around May 30th to August 18th to maintain and create hiking/skiing trails, construct bridges and boardwalks, conduct conservation research projects on CATS' properties, work with volunteers, participate in outdoor education, interact with landowners, and participate in community affairs. They will be supervised by the Director of Trails and Land Management. This is a full-time, seasonal (2-3 months) position, depending on the interns' availability.

When: Approx. May 30 – August 18, 2024 (housing will be provided only during this time, but we are flexible on the date range of the internship)

Accommodations: Interns are provided housing at DaCy Meadow, an agro-tourism farm two miles from Westport's CATS office. They will get a unique opportunity to live in a community connected to a destination town on the shores of Lake Champlain with easy access to the many recreational opportunities in the Adirondack Park. Loaner bikes are available to make transportation between the farm and the CATS office possible.



Primary Responsibilities

Trails:

- Maintain hiking/skiing trails – prune branches, remove fallen trees, mow grass and vegetation where trails go through fields and some forests, install, and replace trail markers and signs, and build bridges and boardwalks.
- Create new trails, including scoping trail routes, and identify infrastructure needs and potential costs.
- Work with, and sometimes supervise, volunteers on trail projects.

Outreach and Outdoor Education:

- Coordinate with the Community Engagement & Outreach Manager on various activities, which may include helping organize and lead public hikes and educational events.
- Assist in supervising volunteer groups (camps, 4H, Scouts, or others.)
- Distribute CATS Trail Maps at designated locations (businesses, kiosks, tourist sites)
- Assess invasives' impacts on trails and work on strategies to address the issues.
- Enhance the interpretation of the natural landscape on CATS trails by developing educational literature that can be shared with the public.
- Assist CATS staff in reviewing and updating trail descriptions on CATS' website.

Land and Conservation Management:

- Review the management plans for CATS properties and work with staff to make updates where needed.
- Develop, or help develop management plans for CATS conservation easement properties.

Qualifications/Preferences:

- Some experience with tools used for trail maintenance: working with hand saws, weed whackers, pruners, shovels, and lawnmowers.
- Exposure to carpentry work: the ability to work on bridge and boardwalk construction.
- Ability to hike much of the day over varied terrains, with mileage sometimes reaching upwards of seven miles for a full day.
- Willing and able to work with walk-behind brush mowers and hand and power tools.
- Ability to work independently and with a team.
- Able to read and interpret topographic maps.
- Good written and verbal communication skills.
- An interest in sustainable trails and land conservation and management.
- Professional attitude and demeanor, highly motivated and responsible.
- Ability to remain flexible under pressure.
- Able to work on occasional weekend days.

- Preferably has a valid driver's license, and a good driving record; experience driving a truck is helpful.
- Proficient in Microsoft Office Suite; social media skills helpful but optional.

Salary and Benefits:

- \$1,360 biweekly pay (paid an hourly rate of \$17.00)
- Reimbursement of miles driven in own vehicle if used for CATS work (not to and from work)
- Outdoor gear discounts
- Housing is provided at no cost to the interns at DaCy Meadow in Westport, NY

About Westport, NY and the Champlain Valley

The town of Westport, where the CATS office is located, is one of the scenic and historic lakefront communities in New York's Champlain Valley. The "Lake Champlain Region," situated where the Adirondack Mountains meet breathtaking Lake Champlain, offers a calm, laid back, and fun-filled quality of life for residents and tourists only a few hour's driving distance from major metropolitan areas. It is located on the eastern edge of the Adirondack Park, a unique 6-million-acre mix of public and private lands protected by state law and region-wide zoning promoting a forever-wild natural environment.
